





Illustration of the Trailer Harness on the Vehicle




INSTALLATION

Customer Information: The information in this installation instruction is intended for use only by skilled technicians who have the proper tools, equipment, and training to correctly and safely add equipment to your vehicle. These procedures should not be attempted by "do-it-yourselfers."

1. Wrap a shop towel around the hood latch.







· Remove the front bulkhead cover.




- Remove the intake air tube.
- Disconnect the negative cable from the battery, then wait at least 3 minutes before starting work.




2. Pull each strap, and fold down the third row seats.




3. Remove the cargo lid.




4. Using a plastic trim tool, remove the access panel.



5. Remove the jack access panel.




6. Remove the jack.




Installing the Control Unit and Control Unit Harnesses

7. Remove the tape, to release the vehicle 14-pin connector as shown.



8. Route the control unit harness 14-pin connector and plug it into the vehicle 14-pin connector.




9. Secure the 14-pin connectors to the back of the left rear side trim panel with the clip on the control unit harness 14-pin connector.




10. Secure the control unit harness to the left rear side trim panel with one wire tie.


11. Install the control unit bracket on the control unit.




Loosely install the washer-bolt on the control unit bracket.



13. Plug the control unit harness 12-pin connector into the control unit.




14. Install the control unit on the vehicle panel as shown.




Routing the Socket Harness

15. Remove the vehicle grommet from the floor panel.



If the vehicle is equipped with the trailer hitch, continue with step 16; otherwise, go to step 17.


16. Refer to the trailer hitch installation instructions, remove the trailer hitch.



- 17. Route the socket harness 8-pin connector and socket harness ground terminal through the vehicle grommet hole, and install the socket harness grommet into the vehicle grommet hole.


 NOTE:
 - Install the socket harness by holding the grommet.
 - Make sure to check that the grommet is secured properly.

18. Remove the two clips, two self-tapping screws, and two bolts from the trailer hitch cover.




19. Remove the trailer hitch cover.

20. Using an utility knife, cut out the trailer hitch cover as shown. Remove any burrs.




21. Install the trailer hitch cover on the rear bumper.

22. Bring the trailer hitch close to the vehicle, install the socket harness 7-pin socket into the trailer hitch with one 6 x 16 mm flange bolt, one 6 x 19 mm shoulder bolt, and two flange nuts.




23. Refer to the trailer hitch installation instructions, install the trailer hitch.


24. Secure the socket harness to the trailer hitch and rear bumper spacer with two wire ties.



25. Secure the socket harness ground terminal and fuse box bracket to the vehicle panel with one ground bolt.




26. Plug the socket harness 8-pin connector into the control unit harness 8-pin connector.




27. Secure the 8-pin connectors to the fuse box bracket with the clip on the control unit harness 8-pin connector.


28. Secure the fuse box on the control unit harness to the fuse box bracket.



29. Install the two relays into the fuse box on the control unit harness.




30. Using isopropyl alcohol on a shop towel, thoroughly clean the floor panel where the aluminum tape will attach.




31. Secure the socket harness to the floor panel with one aluminum tape.

Installing the Fuse

32. In the engine compartment, remove the cover from the sub fuse box.



 Plug the two 20A blade fuses and the 30A block fuse into the sub fuse box.



- 34. Check that all wire harnesses are routed properly and all connectors are plugged in.
- 35. Install all removed parts except for the front bulkhead cover and the intake tube.
- 36. Connect the negative cable to the battery.
- 37. Install the front bulkhead cover and the intake air tube.
- Press and hold the audio unit power button for two seconds to restore the audio and navi (if equipped) system functions.
- 39. Set the clock on vehicles without navigation.
- 40. If necessary, restore the systems back to normal operation as described in the service information.

Check the Operation of the Trailer Harness

41. Refer to the "TRAILER HARNESS TESTER", and perform the "Trailer Harness Circuit Check."
